Directions To Camp

- WMC is located on the peninsula surrounded by the Council Grove Lake across from the Council Grove Marina and Riche Cove.
- Take Hwy 177 until you reach Ave. K. (Going North out of Council Grove).
- Head West on Avenue K for 1.5 miles until you reach 1050 Rd (there's an old schoolhouse on the corner and a sign reading "White Memorial Camp 4.2 miles")
- Drive south on 1050 road for 4.2 miles, past the "Dead End" sign. Follow that road into camp. WMC is the dead end.
- TAKE CARE OF YOUR TIRES. PLEASE DRIVE SLOWLY DOWN THE GRAVEL ROADS. Given the nature of the roads, covered in sharp flint rocks, you don't want to risk a flat tire by driving too fast. We have seen our fair share of tire troubles.

Entering Camp Grounds:

- You'll drive past a stone gate and follow the curved road toward the right.
- As you drive into camp, you'll pass a house, which will be on your left, you'll stay right along the forked road and continue into the camp. On your right will be an outdoor chapel area.
- You'll reach a fork in the road with a wooden "Parking" sign. Don't park there yet! Keep left and head to the office just to the left (northeast).
- You'll see 2 large buildings. The one on your right is our Dining hall. The one on the left is our office building. – the one before the building labeled Big Red Cabin.
- This is where you will go to check in. All of these reference points are very close together so it can be easy to miss. Feel free to call the Director or the Office if you need directions.
- Please check out our map online, or have one sent to you.
- Large events (over 32 people) should plan to check into the office. Otherwise, proceed to your cabin and follow check-in instructions.

WIFI: Some cabins have better connection than others. Little Red, Purple and Blue can be very poor to spotty.

Computers have an easier time than phones. Either way, open a browser and a landing page (like a hotel) for the portal should appear. There will be a checkbox to agree to terms of service. When connecting on your phone, you may have to open a browser to get to the terms of service and login page before using the internet.

KEYPAD: Each cabin has a combination lockbox above the doorknob. Inside is the key to your cabin. Please be sure you've been given the code to your cabin before check-in. Please return key to the lockbox when you check-out.

PAPERWORK AND POINTERS: All guests will be asked to sign a camp policy agreement which includes an assumption of risk and agreeing to property and house rules. If you are booking directly through Camp rather than Airbnb, you will be asked to sign your contract as well as a form for keeping Card on File. We will collect Pet Agreements, Ropes Course waivers and misc. Paperwork as it applies to your group.

LIMITED ACCESS: Unless agreed upon prior and listed in your cabin agreement, your group only has access to your cabin. All other buildings are off limits including the Dining Hall.

Guests are not allowed to use the golf carts.

EXTRA COSTS: Generally, extra costs include:

- Outside guests
- Pet Rent
- Bags of ice
- Kayak / Canoe / Paddle Boat Rental. Everyone wears a life jacket. You can decide to rent boats while on site.
- Low Ropes and High Ropes Challenge Course and Zip Line (need advance notice)

- Prairie Surfing, Hayrack Rides, Splash Mats, and other rentals. (Need advance notice)
- Shooting Range: Archery, Slingshot, Axe Throwing
- Extra beds / Extra linens
- Use of outdoor chapel or amphitheatre for groups over 25 people at a time

STORM SHELTER

In your cabins the safest place is the restroom. Stone walls outside, no windows in the restroom. Otherwise, the storm shelter is located in the basement of the office building. Head to the office building, go through the red door, and straight back will be a door labeled storm shelter that will take you to the basement. You can also get to the basement by going around the building down the hill and entering either door downstairs.

SPORTS EQUIPMENT AND GAMES

Near the dining hall in barrels, plastic storage bin, and along the patio, will be sports balls, cornhole, ladder golf, giant jenga and such. You are welcome to use this equipment and return it to its bins afterward.

NEARBY Should you feel the need to venture beyond the camp grounds, Council Grove is about 20-25 minutes NE of camp. Turn right from K Ave onto I-177 and head South into town.

2. CABIN INFORMATION

For a full description of our lodging and pictures, check us out on Airbnb by searching for cabins in Council Grove, Ks. You can also refer to facebook, our website or the lodging section of our guest book or ask for our Cabin Pricing Packet.

We are a not-for-profit summer camp surrounded by the beautiful flint hills and Council Grove Reservoir. It's all the fun of rustic cabins with the comfort of modern conveniences.

- Our campus sleeps a total of 106 with room to add rollaway beds.
- We have 3 options. Small Cabin, Large Cabin or Apartment.
- **4 Small Cabins** (Little Red, Purple, Green and Blue). Each sleeps 16. They have 2 rooms connected by a spacious lobby. Each room sleeps 8 in 4 bunk bed units. Each room has a window AC unit, multiple floor heating units, box fans, reading lamps, storage shelving, and its own bathroom and shower. The lobby has a small kitchenette with small stove, small oven, mini fridge, full size fridge, microwave, coffee maker and cooking utensils. The lobby has a wood burning fireplace and extra tables and chairs. There is an outdoor fire ring located outside each cabin.
- **Big Red Cabin.** Our large cabin sleeps 32. It has 4 rooms connected by a giant lobby with full kitchen complete with full fridge, standard oven, standard stovetop, dishwasher, microwave, coffee maker and tons of space for eating, meetings, or activities. 2 rooms have handicap accessible bathrooms and showers. Each room sleeps 8 on 4 bunk bed units. Rooms have box fans, reading lamps, storage shelving, and its own bathroom and shower. This cabin has central air and heating. The lobby has a wood burning fireplace and ceiling fans. There is a large fire pit behind this cabin. It is centrally located to the dining hall, storm shelter, pool, and other cabins/playground area.
- **Sunrise Suite Apartment** has 2 bedrooms, 1 bathroom with bathtub/shower, full kitchen and living room. Each bedroom has a full size bed with a twin bed lofted above it. Each room has a closet. The apartment has central air and heating. It has a living room space with couch and chairs and small dining table.
- **Sunset Suite Apartment:** sleeps 4 in one room in 2 bunk beds. Basic small kitchenette, no oven, and small lobby and bathroom with standing shower. Great for a one small groups or those passing through that plan to spend their time exploring.
- Our facilities have Air conditioning, indoor plumbing, private showers and bathrooms.
- Our dining hall, Big Red Cabin, Storm shelter, and public restrooms, are ADA accessible. Our ropes courses offer a few ADA accessible events.
- All of our cabins except the apartments have twin sized bunk bed units.
- The small 16-person cabins have a kitchenette with small oven, stovetop, mini fridge, microwave, coffee maker, kitchen sink and cooking utensils.
- Our 32 person cabin and Apartment have full size stove, full refrigerator, full kitchen sink, microwave, coffee pot, cooking utensils and Big Red has a dishwasher.
- Cabins are grouped in the center of the camp and are all within walking distance of our various facilities and activities.
- **Alcohol** is permitted. Please dispose or recycle all cans, bottles and containers, as we are primarily a summer camp.
- **NOTE:** No alcohol consumption on campus while a summer camp is in session. Upon that group's departure, cabin renters are permitted to drink alcohol on campus or in cabins but must abide by state laws including those set in place for consuming alcohol while on the lake. You will be notified if there is another group in progress prior to your arrival and at check in.
- **Cookware:** **COOKING UTENSILS:** For guests booking through Airbnb or direct cabin rental, we provide basic utensils and supplies. Includes: Pots, Small skillet, medium pan, baking sheet, mixing bowl, spatula, mixing spoons, Grilling utensils, roasting sticks, coffee mugs, cups, plates, bowls, spoons, forks, butter knives, cutting board sheet, can opener, pot holder, hand towel, dish soap, paper towels, dish drying rack, cooking oil, pan spray
- **Linens:** Linens include top and bottom sheets, blanket, pillow, pillowcase, and a towel. Linens are available upon request and generally included with your cabin rental. Please provide us an exact head count prior to your arrival in case no one is on site when you arrive.

- **Extra Linens:** \$10/set unless prior arrangements are made.

Forgotten Linens: Should a guest forget blankets, towels etc of their own, we are happy to provide what you need free of charge.

- Kansas City, Ks: WMC is about 2 - 2 and half hours West/SW of KC, Ks.
- Hays, Ks: WMC is 2 hours and 40 minutes East of Hays, Ks.
- Omaha, Ne: WMC is 3 hours and 40 minutes South of Omaha, Ne.
- Dodge City, KS: WMC is about 4 hours NE of Dodge City, Ks
- Tulsa, Ok: WMC is 4 hours and 15 minutes North of Tulsa, Ok.
- St. Lewis, Mo: WMC is 5 hours and 20 minutes West of St. Lewis, Mo.
- Denver, Co: WMC is 7 hours and 20 minutes East of Denver, Co.
- Melbourne, Australia: WMC is 24 hours NE of Melbourne, Australia.

4. GENERAL INFORMATION AND HOUSE RULES

Arrival & Departure:

Checkout is at 11 a.m. (unless indicated differently in advance).

Check in from Mid August- May: Check-in is 11:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.

Check in from June - early August is generally 1 p.m. – 8:00 p.m.

You will be notified of check-in time in advance if they differ from the above.

- a) Please notify WMC in of your estimated time of arrival prior to your event. We appreciate a call or text once you are closer to camp (for example, an hour away or as you pull off of the highway – and please don't text us while driving, have a passenger contact us!)
- b) **Registration:** Guests must check in and register in the office for cabin rentals. Registration for large events is usually held in the Dining Hall and will have signs guiding the way.

Cleaning and check out.

Groups are responsible for leaving the cabins as clean as they found them. Groups will abide by the house and cleaning rules provided during check in. These include stacking used linens in the lobby, collecting and bagging all trash and storing in closed barrel on the porch, or open barrel in the cabin lobby (to avoid critters), sweeping, cleaning dishes and returning keys to their lockbox.

ATVs, Motorcycles, Motorized Vehicles

ATV's, motorcycles, scooters, golf carts, and other motorized conveyances (except those used in handicap assistance) may be ridden to enter and leave the property only, provided the sound level is kept to a minimum. All vehicles must have headlights and reflectors if used at night.

Campfires: We have multiple fire pits on our grounds, plus portable pits. Each cabin has access to a fire pit. Other fire pits are located at Cedar Point, Amphitheatre, Pavilion, Inspiration Point and near our RV site. All fires must be contained inside the fire rings located on each site. Campfires must not be left unattended. Fire rings must not be used to dispose of cans, bottles, or other household trash. Fire rings are not to be moved without prior approval from management.

NOTE: Please bring your own matches or lighter.

Firewood: WMC generally has firewood on site. Depending on the weather and time of year, wood may be limited. You are welcome to bring your own. Check with WMC prior to arrival to ask about firewood. Guests should bring their own matches or lighter. No trimming or wood gathering from live trees or you could be charged for damages. We accept donations for firewood to help pay those that keep up with splitting, loading and stacking the wood.

Should you run low on firewood, check the shoreline behind little red and under large trees for more firewood.

Fireplace: Big Red, Little Red, Purple, Green and Blue Cabins as well as the dining hall, all have wood burning fireplaces. We generally leave the flues open from fall – spring. Please ask before using in the summer months. Each cabin has a bucket for coals. During the winter we try to keep small wood kindling available for the fireplaces.

Grills: Each cabin has a small charcoal grill and basic grilling utensils. We recommend you bring your own charcoal and lighter fluid as we cannot guarantee we'll have extra supplies on site.

Cell Phone Service

Verizon seems to do well. AT & T is hit and miss and Sprint will have you roaming and service is spotty. Now-a-days you can connect your device to the wifi to do most of your work and phone calls.

Damages, spills and other “oops”

We understand that accidents happen. But we do ask that you please let us know when they do. Chances are, we can fix them as effortlessly as possible which also means better chances of having your full security deposit returned or for those renting with no deposit, we wouldn't have to add any costs to your credit card.

Boat Dock: If you are a renter or camp guest, once your boat is in the water you are welcome to tie it up to the dock.

Lake Cove:

Anyone is welcome to fish from the shore or on boat in the cove. The lake is governed by the Corp of Engineers so the cove is open to the public, however the boat dock (and water trampoline) is WMC private property. Once you climb onto the shore or wish to drive in and fish from the property, you are considered on WMC grounds. If you are interested in fishing from the shoreline, or anywhere else on the peninsula, please call the camp or camp director for permission or ask upon arrival.

Swimming in the Cove: Guests may swim in the cove. Do not go further than the buoy. Guests MUST wear lifejackets and sign our swimming waiver before entering the lake or boating. You may use the dock to jump off of. WMC has lifejackets available upon request.

Parking is allowed in the designated area behind the Dining Hall, on gravel roads in front of cabins so long as there is room for other vehicles to pass, Parking in the grass next to cabins, cabin porches, or other grassy areas are for unloading and loading only.

Pets: We have pet friendly cabins and our RV sites. You must receive permission to bring pets prior to arrival. Guests may bring up to 2 domestic pets up to 80lbs each. Pet owners must secure a pet policy from the office and abide by all of the rules stated and pay Pet Rent. Guests must immediately pick up all droppings. Barking or any other behavior that disturbs other guests is not allowed and noisy or aggressive pets will not be allowed to stay. We recommend bringing a carrier or kennel.

Plumbing

The easiest way to disrupt an enjoyable stay is a plumbing problem. To prevent this, we kindly ask you to please place things like sanity napkins in the sanitary bin we've provided in the bathroom. We simply want to ensure you have a royal flush kind of holiday :)

Recycling

White Memorial Camp encourages guests to recycle plastic, aluminum, cardboard/paper, and glass. Recycling bins can be found on the west side of the Dining Hall by the dumpster on the road to the amphitheatre.

House Rules. For full info on what is and is not permitted, see our “White Memorial Camp Policies – Exhibit A” Due to issues in the past, and for your safety, and to ensure the safety of our site, and because we hate filling out paperwork please abide by the following rules.

- **Ask before assuming:** Please check with us if you are uncertain about what is included in your rental. Generally, unless specified ahead of time, your rental is just one cabin and no dining hall. Avoid entering other buildings. Thanks!
- **Behavior** Being a non-profit, we rent to support our camp programming. We hope you’ll have fun in whatever way suits you. Please help us continue our programming by listening to that gut feeling that says “maybe I shouldn’t climb up the outside of the water slide and use it as a high dive into the swimming pool. Maybe I shouldn’t push the golf cart into a hiding place to see how long it takes them to find it. Maybe I shouldn’t take this neat toy home with me for my friends to play with.” You know, things like that!
- **Cleanliness:** Whilst we do a thorough professional clean between each guest stay, we kindly ask that prior to leaving, you follow our Cabin Care checklist. It helps us get through our cleaning process quicker and allows us to keep cleaning costs down for you and future guests.
- **Climbing:** We know our high and low ropes challenge courses are cool, we are proud of them. We are also proud that no one has been seriously injured on them. Help us keep that record going by NOT CLIMBING ON THEM without a WMC facilitator present and waivers signed.
- **Drugs:** Elicit drugs. What you do in your personal time is entirely up to you, but when staying at our place we have a strict no drug use policy. This is just the law... not so much one of our rules.
- **Electricity:** Lights / AC / Heating - To keep our costs down (and pass those savings on to our guests) we kindly ask that you switch off lights and the A/C or heating when its not in use or leaving the house. Mother nature thanks you too."
- **Occupancy:** We ask that you kindly respect our maximum occupancy requirement. We have this in place instead of an additional guest charge in an attempt to keep costs down for you. No more than 20 people per small cabin or 40 people in Big Red.
- **Extra Guests** We understand that for a whole verity of reasons, you may want additional guests to stay in the place. In the event that you want additional guests to stay, please contact us to let us know. We’re reasonable folk and will accommodate wherever possible
- **Vehicles:** Do not use camp vehicles (golf carts, pontoon boat, etc) without advance written permission, proof of insurance, and deposit.

RV/ Popup Camper: Can I hook up my camper or RV at the camp?

Yes! We have a handful of RV/Camper sites. Our hookups are 110 volts with a variety of plug in types - Standard outlet and 220 plug ins. We charge by the night and restrooms and showers are available upon request. Our dining hall has public restrooms and a handicap accessible shower open for use. The sites are within walking distance of a water spout and we have no sewer hook ups or dumping sites. Please review our RV/Camper and Campsite Policies.

>**Note:** RV sites include swimming and grounds fees for up to 7 people per site. Any other guests must pay the day pass fee and for use of the pool and equipment.

Sharing is caring

- Please return sports and activity equipment to designated areas near the dinging hall as it’s a central location so all renters and guests can take advantage of them.
- Since this is often a shared property with multiple occupants, we like to ensure everyone has their own space. We kindly ask guests to refrain from entering other cabins and campsites. We’ll ensure your space is likewise respected in return.
- **Scheduling:** We have sign up sheets available in the office for facilitated or rented events. We will try to ensure there is no overlap in scheduling regarding boat use, ropes course or other activities, but should there be multiple parties wishing to use something at the same time, we encourage you to be polite and discuss your options. If you need assistance contact our site manager.

Smoking We are a family establishment, therefore there is no smoking inside cabins or other facilities. Only smoke in designated areas. (i.e. behind the dining hall or near your fire pit away from other Cabin Renters). Please do not leave cigarette butts on the ground, or in fire pits as we are primarily a summer camp and

promote caring for the outdoors. Please don't throw them in the fire rings either. Coffee cans, ashtrays and so on are preferred.

Storm Shelter: In case of strong storms, you are safest in the cabin bathrooms or our designated storm shelter in the basement of our office building where there is a bathroom, shower, plenty of seating and cots to sleep on. It is our craft and game resource room, so there's even something to keep the kids' minds off of the weather!

Swimming Pool: Splash around in our 65,000-gallon pool with 3 waterslides, pool toys and shaded seating. No diving. If you're renting a cabin, hosting a retreat, reunion or other event, you have the option of reserving a lifeguard or swimming on your own after signing the waiver.

We ask that guests shower off before using the pool, especially after swimming in the lake to prevent algae. Ask about hiring a lifeguard if you have a large group.

All swimmers must sign a waiver before using the pool or lake without a lifeguard.

>Pool Hours: 7 a.m. – 10:00 p.m. Sun – Thurs. 7 a.m. – 12:00 a.m. Fri – Sat. (Unless gate is locked for pool-cleaning or permission is granted for an early or late swim)

Tent campers: We have plenty of open grounds, areas surrounded by trees, a valley, and spaces near our bathrooms and shower for those that wish to tent camp. See our lodging information and pricing sheet for more details. Each campsite is allowed 2 vehicles, pets with prior approval, and will be charged a per night fee of \$10. Guests beyond those camping will be subject to the day pass and pool fees.

Quiet Time Unless your group has exclusive use of the campgrounds, quiet time is from 10:30 PM to 7:00 AM. If you are the sole group at the camp, or have paid for exclusive rights to the grounds, there are no quiet hours.

Where can I rent a boat other than a canoe or kayak?

Council Grove Marina is the only place on the lake with a boat ramp. Here you can buy a fishing license, rent a boat, buy equipment or even get a boat toed if needed.
